CONFIRMATION


In the Sacrament of Confirmation, the baptized person is "sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit" and is strengthened for service to the Body of Christ. It is one of the three sacraments of initiation into the Catholic Church, the other two being Baptism and Holy Communion.

BOOK AND BARK AT THE PARK

Last week we enjoyed a morning at Bannockburn Oval where our Kindergarten students spent time reading books with their Yr 6 buddies. The rationale behind Book and Bark at the Park is centred around ideals promoted in the book, 'Madeline Finn and the Library Dog' (see below). There is also extensive research around the therapeutic benefits of dogs. Reading to dogs is just that – encouraging children to read alongside a dog. The practice originated in the US in 1999 with the Reading Education Assistance Dogs (READ) scheme.



Madeline Finn does not like to read. Not books. Not magazines. Not even the menu on the ice cream van. Fortunately, Madeline meets Bonnie, a library dog. Reading aloud to Bonnie isn't so bad. When Madeline Finn gets stuck, Bonnie doesn't mind. As it turns out, it's fun to read when you're not afraid of making mistakes. Bonnie teaches Madeline Finn that it's okay to go slow, to keep trying, and to get support from a friend.

With preparation by class teachers and working closely with parents, numerous 'appropriate' dogs were nominated for this activity. It was a huge success.







NAPLAN

There have been many reports in the wider media about negative aspects of the NAPLAN assessments. At SHP we have successfully managed to engage in the new process with limited challenges and a small number of glitches. This year Yr 5 completed all tests online. Yr 3 completed numeracy/language conventions/reading online and the writing component was a pencil/paper test. It is a new experience for both schools and students.



NATIONAL SIMULTANEOUS STORY TIME

Today is a celebration of literacy and SHP will be having fun reading 'Alpacas with Maracas' by Matt Cosgrove. We like to take every opportunity to foster a love of literature. Perhaps you can ask your child some questions about alpacas or maracas today. Every class will read this text today.

Drive through


Our Drive Through procedures are in place to assist the safe arrival and departure of children via Bobbin Head Rd car park. Thank you to all who are making use of this option to drop off and pick up your children.

In the **morning**, parents **kiss and drop** – children are asked to get out of the car near the pedestrian crossing. Parents are asked to please remain in your car to allow for quick drop off. Children are not to walk through the carpark unattended.

In the **afternoon**, our **Bobbin Head Road car park** is dedicated to Drive Through from 3pm – 3.20pm each afternoon. Teachers on Drive Through duty bring the children around from the playground and supervise the children sitting under cover outside the Administration block. The family name is called and the children are assisted into the car.

Drive through still operates during wet weather and students will need to wear a raincoat to protect them from the weather.

In order to prevent cars overflowing onto Bobbin Head Road, parents are asked to make a second line to avoid blocking the entrance gate or spilling out onto Bobbin Head Road.



Points to remember:

- PLEASE NOTE Bobbin Head Road car park is dedicated to Drive Through. Please do not park in this carpark if you are collecting your child from the playground.
- Parents wishing to get out and pick up their child are to park in the Richard Porter Way cark park.
- Please display your sign clearly so the teacher on duty can read your family name.

In an article for *The Catholic Weekly* on 18 April, 2019, Dr Kevin Donnelly, Senior Research Fellow at the Australian Catholic University, asked his reader:

"What does Easter mean for you? For many, in an increasingly materialistic and pleasure driven society, it's all about hot cross buns, chocolate Easter eggs and an extended weekend with family and friends.

For Christians, on the other hand, Easter involves the betrayal, death and resurrection of Christ and the knowledge that while this world might be a vale of tears, if one embraces the Word of God, there will be eternal deliverance and salvation.

FROM KU-RING-GAI COUNCIL - CHILD CAR SEATS

Recently there have been media reports about when a child can safely travel in a car using an adult lap-sash seatbelt. We are encouraging schools to help remind their families about best practice in child car seat safety.

It is important to ensure children are fastened in the correct child car seat for their size, not only their age and that it is fitted correctly. A child who is properly secured in an approved child car seat is less likely to be injured in a car crash than one who is not.

Although children from 7 years of age can legally use an adult lap-sash seatbelt without a booster seat, most children of this age are **not at the recommended height** to do so. The child's size, is the most important thing to consider.

It is strongly recommended **Children should not use an adult lap-sash seatbelt until they are a minimum of 145cm tall.**

Some children don't reach 145 cm tall until around 10 or 11 years of age.

Your child should be moved from a booster seat to a seatbelt when:

- Their shoulders no longer fit comfortably within the booster seat; or
- Their eye-level is higher than the back of the booster seat; or
- If your child car seat has shoulder marks, move your child to a seatbelt when his/her shoulders have passed the upper marks.

This five-step test can help assess whether your child is big enough to be safely restrained by an adult lap-sash seatbelt.

The child should be able to:

- 1. Sit with their back against the seat back
- 2. Bend their knees comfortably over the front of the seat cushion
- 3. Sit with the sash belt across their mid-shoulder
- 4. Sit with the lap belt across the top of their thighs
- 5. Remain in this position for the whole trip.
