Once a term, staff and parents of Sacred Heart assist with preparation and serving of food to the homeless at Hornsby. Our next date is Tuesday 30 July 2019. We require volunteers for driving, cooking, companionship/serving.

FRIENDSHIP AT THE VAN: Is between 6.00-7.00pm. Please meet the van in the driveway between TAFE and Hornsby Pool. The van driver for each shift is the designated Night Supervisor

HOT FOOD: Must be dropped off to Sacred Heart School no later than 5.15pm. The school has 3 x stainless steel 'hot pots' should which you can collect from the office. We have no facilities to heat food up so please ensure you utilise the 'hot pots' or drop the food off as close to 5:15pm as possible.

COLD FOOD: Can be dropped off before 3.00 pm but definitely before 5.00 pm

Please ensure the food is sent in in disposable containers. Should you use your own container please make sure they have your name clearly displayed on them.


