### Resignation of Mr Peter Hamill, Director of Schools Broken Bay

Peter was appointed as Director of Schools in 2012 with the significant role of overseeing our 44 schools with around 16000 students and 11000 staff. Dr Tony Bracken is currently Deputy Director of Schools and he will be acting director of Broken Bay Catholic schools until that role is filled.

Many thanks to the parents who helped with THE DISH last night at Hornsby. The Dish is organised to feed needy and homeless people at Hornsby, near the swimming pool. Sacred Heart parents have helped The Dish for many, many years. Each term a team of parents cook food, serve food, provide company and drive the van which has supplies such as plates, cutlery and other supplies. Children do not help on site at Hornsby however I am aware that some families encourage their children to help prepare the food.

Last night we had a bumper crowd of people needing to be fed. There were both young and old wanting to enjoy a home cooked meal. Thank you to the parents who dropped off some amazing dishes which prompted comments such as 'Gordon Ramsay step aside'.

If you are keen to help with The Dish, you will see it advertised in the school newsletter, usually week 2 of each term. You might like to cook a dish and send it in or come and help serve the food.

Also a huge hit for our needy and homeless people is an initiative started by SHP parents, providing 'take-home packs' – juice, cereal, UHT milk, small packets of biscuits etc, etc. Our needy and homeless people LOVE these.

Last night one of our clients arrived after the main course had been served. If there are leftovers, we provide 'take away containers' and invite people to take some food with them for the next day. Let me tell you, they ask us to scrape the bowl and put every last morsel in their take away containers. When this latecomer asked for food and we said it was all gone one of the clients said straight away, 'You can have the take away food that I've got'. It was very moving seeing this kindness.

## RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

### First Eucharist

The sacrament of Eucharist celebrates and nourishes our Christian journey to God. It calls us to faith, to proclamation of the Word, to communion with Jesus and one another and challenges us to be people of his mission today



While the responsibility for preparation for full initiation of children into the Eucharistic community lies primarily with parents and the parish community, the learning that takes place at school is designed to support the Parish Sacramental Program for First Eucharist.

The module at school focuses on developing the students' understanding of the mystery of Christ's presence in the Eucharist and its meaning for the Catholic Disciple. In class, students explore Jesus' real presence with us when we participate and share in the celebration of the Eucharist. They learn to identify with and describe the words and actions of the priest during the Eucharistic prayer. Students explore the messages of key scripture passages and their relationship to understanding the Sacrament of Eucharist. This learning provides the

essential link between family, parish and school. At this time, parents and carers are offered the opportunity to remember who they are as baptised people confirmed in the Spirit.

In Luke 14:7-14, *Choosing a Place at the Table*, Jesus told a parable to highlight the importance of coming together in any given setting as equals. Our mission on earth is one of serving others and we can do this by the respect which we give to all humankind. Jesus had great compassion for those who were marginalised. Through the telling of this parable, he encourages us to do likewise, always seeing the value of another. When we come to the table to share Eucharist, all traces of self-importance must fall away and, as we are nourished by the Sacrament, we move into the world seeking by word and deed to bring about God's kingdom here and now.

We ask you to please keep in your prayers especially our students who are preparing to receive the Sacrament of Eucharist for the first time.

## AQUABLISS NEWS

### Swimming In Winter Myths - Part 2

Part 1 busted the myth that children only need to know swim safety in summer and that cold weathers cause colds. Not true. Continuing on, here are 3 additional myths Aquabliss hears from parents, which demonstrate why continuing to swim all year round is important.

#### Myth 3: Swimming is a summer sport

**Swimming is a year-round sport.** As a low impact activity, swimming complements other sports and can help build endurance, fitness and flexibility. For active kids who play soccer, football or basketball, swimming can help ease sore muscles and can help keep arm and leg extensions strong.

As **safety does not have a season**, the best way to become a strong and confident swimmer is to jump in and keep your child swimming through the colder months.

Our pool is indoors with water heated to 32 degrees, so don't have your child miss out on all of these benefits due to these misconceptions. Plus, Aquabliss have installed **upgraded air heaters to keep parents warm on the pool deck** whilst swimmers enjoy the heated pool.

#### **Myth 4: My child will pick it back up in summer**

The process of **learning to swim does not have a 'finish,'** and a key to keeping your child safer in the water is consistency.

By learning and developing skills every week, your child will **build a foundation that will last a lifetime.** Often kids who hit pause during winter will regress and will lose confidence. **Consistency and routine builds a steady momentum,** and when kids lose this, they often lose their confidence and interest too.

To instill a lifelong love of swimming and give your kids the experience they need to be water-wise, **sticking to lessons in all seasons is paramount.**

#### **Myth 5: Cold and wet conditions cause ear infections**

Much like colds, **ear infections are caused by viruses and bacteria – not pools.** Babies and young children have smaller eustachian tubes, so they tend to get more ear infections. These aren't caused by wet conditions but are usually the result of a cold which has travelled up into the middle ear. When water gets trapped in the ear canal, it can lead to an easily treated condition called "Swimmers Ear."

**Swimmers Ear can occur in all seasons,** not just winter. If your child is prone to this condition, there are a range of barriers such as earplugs, ear bands and swim caps that can help keep their ears dry and clean whilst they continue swimming in our classes.


