Principal's Message

Reporting

At the end of this term, we will be providing a student report to parents. The Federal Education Minister, Dan Tehan, has approved changes to the regulation for Semester One, 2020 reports. The reported outcomes for this Semester One period have been especially selected and adjusted to include two periods of school attendance interrupted by a period of Home-Based Learning. Schools have been given flexibility in the teaching of the NSW Curriculum in 2020. Whilst continuity of learning was maintained through home-based learning, not all Key Learning Areas (KLAs) were able to be taught and assessed to the same extent.

Throughout the Home-Based learning period, teachers have phoned parents to check on the progress and challenges of the different learning environment. Further to this, to enable parents the opportunity to discuss this report and goal setting for Semester Two, the school will arrange 'phone' interviews during week 10 of this term.

Professional Learning


